VALE, PASTOR BONE ET FIDELIS!

Farewell, good and faithful shepherd! Our second pastor, Fr. Ferdinand Wesloh, died this past Monday. He was a couple of months shy of being 80 years old. His funeral Mass was held just this past Friday at the Mother of Good Counsel Home (on Natural Bridge) where he had been residing. He was pastor here for 12 years, from 1992-2004, succeeding our founding pastor, Fr. Paul Kersgieter, who had served here for 30 years. He is certainly well-remembered among our people as a calm and steady leader. We will have a special Mass for him here at St. Angela on All Souls' Day (this coming Friday; see below) at 10:00AM.

ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS

This coming Thursday, November 1, is, of course, All Saints' Day, and is also, of course, a holy day of obligation. Consequently, we will have Mass at 6:00PM on Hallowe'en, and at 8:00AM & 7:00PM on the day itself. The following day is All Souls' Day (not a holy day of obligation, but it sets the tone for the whole month of remembrance of our beloved dead and our prayers for them).

Traditionally, three Masses are celebrated on All Souls' Day, and so we will have Mass at 6:30AM, the usual 8:00AM Mass, and a special Mass for Fr. Wesloh (see above) at 10:00AM.

Farewell to the beautiful flowers of spring! It was a lovely run, but now we must say good-bye to the exquisitely gorgeous flowers that beautified our parish grounds all spring, summer and fall. Everybody, and I mean *everybody*, who visits our parish comments on the attractiveness of our gardens, with equally high praise for the gardeners. I, who had nothing to do with it, am the recipient of all this praise, but I accept it with good grace on behalf of all those who really did the heavy lifting, and I am always pleased to acknowledge their efforts whenever I can. And so, once again, on behalf of the whole parish, I give glory, laud and honor to our green-thumbed horticulturalists, and, in your name, beg them to return next spring for an even more florid season of botanical delights!

IN HONOR OF OUR LOCAL AMERICAN SAINTS...

...we will have our next ethno-hagiographical dinner on Friday, Nov. 16, from 4:30-7:00PM. This one will take place in the gym and will feature American cuisine with a distinctive St. Louis flavor. In specific, it will include barbecued St. Louis-style baby back ribs and pork steaks, prepared under the expert supervision of that guru of the gridiron, the undisputed King of 'Cue, William Johnson, with all the rest being prepared by that Count of the Kitchen, Don Krause. This is to honor the American saints whose feasts fall that week, namely, St. Frances X. Cabrini (Nov. 13) and St. Rose Philippine Duchesne (our local girl, (Nov. 18). True, it is disputed whether St. Philippine ever actually consumed a pork steak or toasted ravioli, but now that she's experiencing the bliss of heaven, I'm sure she knows what a delight it is to do so, since those things are the nearest thing to heaven until the real thing comes along (especially as prepared by our chefs)!

10. When a blessed item is no longer usable, how should one dispose of it?





CONTINUED ANSWERS: 1. Benedict 2. St. Gregory the Great suggested it at a time when a lethal plague, whose major symptom was sneezing, was ravaging Italy 3. On Feb. 3, the feast of St. Blaise (patron of those afflicted with diseases of the throat) 4. It's the traditional Epiphany blessing of doors; "20" is for the first 2 digits of the year and 19 is for the last 2, CMB is for "Christus mansem benedicat" ("may Christ bless this house", or it might refer to the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, & Balthassar) and the plus-signs are actually crosses. The whole message is written with a chalk specially blessed for Epiphany. 5. Sacrilege 6. It means that they have been "beatified" and are in heaven, and are, therefore, worthy of the veneration that we give those who dwell above. Most of all, it means that we celebrate their feast days. The feast of a canonized "saint" is celebrated by the whole Church; for a beatified "blessed", the feast is only celebrated where the blessed one lived. 7. A blessing may be delivered by anyone, but it means different things. When a lay person blesses another, it constitutes wishing the other one well. In the Church, only priests have the power to bless, i.e., to call down divine favor upon a person or thing in such a way as to cause a change in the recipient of the blessing. Certain blessings can only be given by a bishop or the pope himself. 8. Sacramentals 9. a) it arouses pious emotions in the faithful, b) it liberates us from the power of demons, c) it can preserve or restore health d) and sundry other spiritual and physical benefits 10. It should be utterly destroyed so that it can never be subjected to profane use; usually this means burning it or, if not possible, burying it

SMART STRATEGIES FOR YEAR END GIVING TO CHARITY

The new tax law raised the standard deduction, so fewer taxpayers will take itemized deductions for charitable gifts for 2018. But you can still apply tax-saving strategies to your giving. Traditional IRA owners age 70 1/2 and older can use a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) to transfer up to \$100,000 per year tax-free from their IRA directly to a qualified charity. It lowers your taxable income and can satisfy a required minimum distribution.

All Souls day Mass will be on Friday, November 2nd at 6:30am, 8:00am and 10:00am.



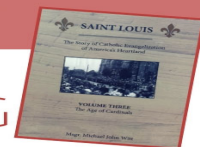

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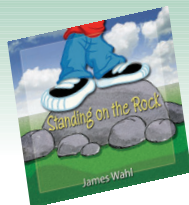
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
