## *From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:*

**REMEMBER THAT FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY!**

### **RACISM**

Archbishop Carlson asked us, his pastors, to “consider...addressing in some way the topic of racism” this Lent. I decided to do precisely that, but in this particular medium, because racism is such a hot-button, trip-wire, hair-trigger topic that I wanted to put what I have to say in writing so that I won’t be misquoted (but I can only hope that I won’t be misunderstood). Most of this week’s column will be taken up with this most current of all subjects.

Many people hoped that the residual wounds of racial strife that were still hanging around from the sad days of slavery and segregation and the Jim Crow laws would have at last been healed by the election of a black president. Sadly, that hasn’t happened, despite many other changes as well. In fact, it seems that those wounds have deepened, hence the Archbishop’s call for us to address it.

What is there to say, that racism is wrong? Of course it is. Does anybody deny that? I don’t think so, and anyone who did probably wouldn’t be reading these or any other pastor’s remarks in any parish bulletin, anyway (and if they did, it wouldn’t change their thinking). In that regard, it’s a lot like any other sin. Take lying as an example. Even though the vast majority of people would say that lying is wrong and that they hate to be lied to, those same people probably tell lies (of varying degrees of magnitude) from time to time. Why is that so? It all goes back to Original Sin and the basic weakness of our fallen human nature. And so it shouldn’t surprise anyone to find that people who say that racism is wrong are still have racist thoughts, or make racist statements, from time to time. What’s the solution? It’s the same as in lying; admit the sin, make a firm purpose of amendment, and try to avoid it in the future. I don’t think we’ll ever create a 100% racism-free society any more than we’ll ever get a completely truth-telling one, either, but we have to keep striving for perfection in both areas (and others as well!).

One area in which great progress has been made is in the marginalization of organizations which, though racist in their origins and purpose, had once held a certain status of prestige in America. I’m talking about groups like the Ku Klux Klan (several members of which actually once held seats in the Federal House of Representatives and Senate!) and the Nuwaubian Nation, a black supremacist group.

There remains, however, one organization which, though racist in its origins and ‘way more murderous than even the Klan, not only still exists, but enjoys *tremendous* prestige among the elite *illuminati* of America. Furthermore, literally *hundreds of millions* of your tax dollars go to support their racist policies and activities every year. This organization was founded in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century as part of the “Eugenics” movement. *Eugenics* is a Greek word meaning “well born” and, following the teaching of Charles Darwin, this organization, called The American Birth Control League (ABCL) strove to “perfect” the human species. Naturally, it had its own definition of what perfect humanity looked like. Not surprising, it looked an awful lot like the founders of the ABCL, namely, white and European (but only *northern* European!). The face of the ABCL was Margaret Sanger, who used to brag about the ABCL’s success in getting the “darker races” to stop procreating by co-opting the support of their pastors in her infamous “Negro Project” in 1939. That was their goal: to make it so that only the “right” people would reproduce. What could be more racist than that?

If the ABCL sounds to you a lot like the Nazis, who promoted their own race as the “Master Race”, then go to the head of the class. The ABCL, in fact, was quite popular in Hitler’s Germany, so much so, that when WWII ended and it became known that the ABCL was complicit with Hitler, the ABCL went underground and then changed its name. To what? You guessed it: **PLANNED PARENTHOOD (PP)**. As the old Exxon commercials used to say, they changed their name but not their stripes. That’s why you find offices of PP mostly in areas that have a high percentage, like ours, of minority population. And they have been effective: black women comprise 6% of our population, yet now they have 35% of all abortions. To PP, that’s “progress”!
