From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

**REMEMBER THAT JANUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY CHILDHOOD OF JESUS!
BE IT RESOLVED!**

A lot of people still make New Year's "resolutions", based on the thinking that the new year provides a golden opportunity to change the self so to as improve it, either by cutting away the bad habits or supplanting them with authentic virtues. Let me recommend one for you: that in 2019 you will draw closer than ever to the Lord. Along with that rather unspecific goal, I prescribe two concrete ways of doing it: 1) come to daily Mass, and 2) come to the Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesdays (between 9:00AM and 7:00PM). There are other things, too, like making a retreat at White House (or some other worthy facility), but I promise that if you do make the effort to do these things, even if intermittently, they will change your life for the better!

OUR BEAUTIFUL PARISH

G. K. Chesterton once observed that the Romans didn't love Rome because she was the most beautiful city in the world; they loved her because she was *their* city, and so they strove to make her into the most beautiful city in the world. Such is the transformative power of love. I think of that when I ponder how faithfully and diligently our people strive to beautify our parish buildings and grounds for each appropriate season. I make this observation in the afterglow of a magnificent Christmas season in which our parish church was decorated and beautified like never before. (You can always tell the extent to which the people appreciate the beauty of our church by the number of pictures, posed and unposed, that are taken; this year it was a *bunch*!) As your pastor, my bosom swells with pride to see our people so lovingly garnishing our church for all the major holidays and nurturing our gardens so aesthetically and tenderly in the warm months of the year. It is, of course, nice to have beautiful gardens and a handsomely adorned church, but to me the most touching aspect of it is the love which underlies it and motivates such devotion and care. God bless all those who work so hard to give us something that we all enjoy so well!

WAIT FOR IT

I'm talking, of course, about the great Italian dinner that will be served to honor our parish patroness, St. Angela Merici on Saturday, Jan. 26. We will again be serving the St. Angela Merici label wine, vented from our own parish vineyards and lovingly bottled by the Schilly's, Gerry and Wayne. Don't miss it (and invite old parishioners to return!)

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Today is the feast of the Lord's Baptism. Let's find out how much about it you know:

1. Who baptized the Lord?
2. In what river was He baptized?
3. Why was Jesus' baptizer reluctant to do it?
4. How did Jesus' baptizer compare the baptism he gave with the one Jesus would render?
5. What great turning point in Jesus' life occurred at His Baptism?
6. What *theophany* (i.e., divine manifestation) accompanied Jesus' Baptism?
7. What does the Greek word from which we derive the word "baptism" mean?
8. By what method was Jesus baptized?
9. What is the significance of the Father's voice as it was heard at Jesus' Baptism?
10. How old was Jesus when He was baptized?

ANSWERS: 1. *His cousin, St. John the Baptist* 2. *The Jordan (traditionally, at the point at which it departs from the Sea of Galilee)* 3. *Because, being the Lord, Jesus should have been baptizing him* 4. *"I baptize you with water; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire", said St. John the Baptist* 5. *It would mark the beginning of His Public Life* 6. *The descent of the Holy Spirit (in the form of a dove) and the voice of the Heavenly Father is heard* 7. *To dip or dunk* 8. *We're not sure, but it would either have been by immersion (i.e., dipping or plunging) or infusion (in which water is poured over the head of the candidate as he stands in water up to his waist or knees)* 9. *After doing most of the talking in the Old Testament, the Heavenly Father only speaks three times in the New, this time proclaiming that Jesus is the One who should be listened to* 10. *St. Luke tells us that He was about 30*

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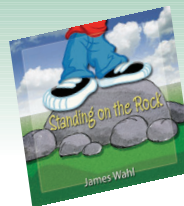
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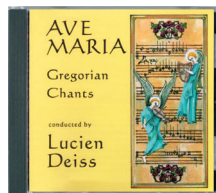
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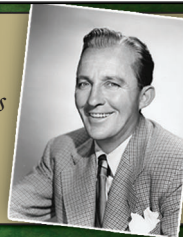
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
