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From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY!

SS. PHILIPPINE AND FRANCES

Don't forget our big dinner this Friday, November 15, to honor our local saints, Rose Philippine Duchesne and Frances Xavier Cabrini. You know it's going to be delicious and you're going to have a wonderful time, so plan on joining us from 4:30-7:00PM (in the lunchroom)!

RECOMMENDED ACTIVITY FOR THE MONTH

I recommend this: visit the cemeteries where your beloved dead are buried, decorate their graves and pray for them there.

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Let's continue quizzing on the saints (this being their month, after all). See if you can correctly identify these aspects of the Church's veneration of the souls in heaven:

1. What is a *relic* of a saint?
2. Identify the various classes of relics?
3. What qualifies a relic as belonging to one type or another?
4. What is the fancy theological term for the veneration we give to the saints?
5. The Blessed Mother, though only a saint herself (and not God), is given a special kind of veneration; name it.
6. Why isn't it a violation of the First Commandment that we have statues of the saints in our churches?
7. What are the three stages of the canonization process?
8. How can we be sure that the soul of a given person is actually in heaven? What kind of proofs do we look for?
9. From looking at the statue or image of a saint, how can one identify which saint it is?
10. What does the word "saint" mean?

BONUS QUESTION: What is the fancy theological term for the adoration and praise that is given to God alone?

ANSWERS: 1. Any physical object connected with a saint in some way and communicates the presence of that saint 2. Relics are of the first, second, or third class 3. 1st class: any part of the saint's body, e.g., bone, flesh, hair, tooth, blood, etc., 2nd class: any personal effect of a saint, e.g. clothing, books, handwriting, chairs, etc., 3rd class: anything touched to a first or second class relic 4. *Dulia* (which means "service") 5. Hyper-dulia (which means "super service") 6. Because, unlike the Eucharist in the tabernacle, neither the statues themselves nor the persons they depict are objects of worship, but only reminders of the heavenly patrons who pray for us constantly 7. First, after a lengthy examination of a person's life and it is found to be of exceptionally high caliber and free from taint of evil, the candidate is declared "venerable", and we start to look for signs that he is in heaven (usually miraculous healings); second, after a miracle has been verified (and there's still no skeletons found in the closet), the subject is "beatified", which means that he is surely in heaven and that those most closely related to him (e.g., the members of the order he founded or the citizens of his city) are now authorized to celebrate his feast day and he is given the title "blessed"; third, after another miracle, the subject is "canonized", i.e., his feast is now eligible to be celebrated by the universal Church at large and is given the title "saint" 8. As described in the answer for #7, the canonization process requires that someone be assigned with the task of "digging up dirt" on each candidate, in order to determine whether or not there's any chance of his not being in heaven (this person is actually called the "devil's advocate"). In addition, the promoter of his cause (the "angel's advocate") is looking for heroic virtue on the candidate's part. If it has been determined that the candidate either exhibited heroic virtue his whole life through or overcame his serious flaws heroically, then the Church starts looking for miraculous cures which are beyond the body's normal healing prowess or medical treatments, and which can only be attributed to the intercession of the candidate. The process is different in the case of a martyr, who, by definition, showed the greatest act of love by laying down his life. That act alone is reckoned to have virtue sufficient for eternal life, and precludes the necessity for further investigation. 9. In the case of a modern saint (e.g., St. John Paul II), his likeness would be readily identified, but nobody knows what St. Peter

looked like, and so in the case of an ancient saint for whom there is no remembered likeness, he is usually depicted attired and/or holding objects that are associated with him through his legend. In the case of martyrs, they are usually depicted holding the instrument of their martyrdom (e.g., St. Peter holds keys, for Christ gave him the "keys to the Kingdom of heaven" and St. Lawrence holds a gridiron because he met his martyrdom upon one) 10. It derives from the Latin sanctus, which means "holy" **BONUS ANSWER: Latria**

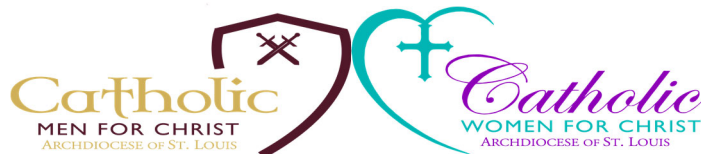

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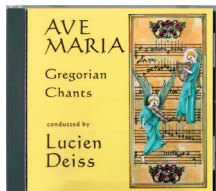
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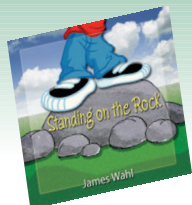
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
