From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY!

THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY, continued

Our Lady, in several of her apparitions, has promised countless blessings (and the side-stepping from many evils) to those who pray her rosary. Armed with those promises, and further buttressed by the lived experience of millions of souls in heaven, we promote that rosary not only as a magnificent exercise of devotion, but also of mental prayer (i.e., meditation), which is the most powerful kind of prayer. When I say that, I mean that it is uniquely potent in its ability to draw us into the presence of God. All prayer is communication with the Almighty: we talk to Him (and He listens), then He talks to us (and we're supposed to listen, too). Sadly, many people only reach the stage of talking to God, and never take the time to listen to Him as He speaks to us. Let's face it: what we have to say to God isn't any great shakes. When He speaks to us, however, and we finally start to listen, then the whole universe starts to change. That's precisely what meditation is: listening to the voice of God. As we meditate on the mysteries of the rosary while we pray, we are drawn into an ever deeper personal experience of those mysteries, and of God Himself. Pray the rosary this month and every day of your life. It will change you.
