

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY!

LET US GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD, OUR GOD!

I believe that it was President Lincoln during the Civil War when our country first determined to set aside the fourth Thursday of every November as a national day of thanksgiving to Almighty God. A few things have changed since then. Many of our fellow countrymen refuse to acknowledge even God's existence, much less that we have a duty to thank Him. Even so, it is "right and just" to give Him thanks, and we will certainly do that here at St. Angela, and I invite you all to come to church here on that day for our annual 9:00AM Mass of Thanksgiving. We will have the traditional collection of food items for the hungry and money for the St. Vincent de Paul Society to further the wonderful work that they do. We will also have blessed bread for your family dinner table. Despite all the bad news and chaos, the path toward making things right begins with a proper relationship with the Almighty, and that begins first with sorrow for our sins and then gratitude for His saving grace. So in the words of the old hymn: "Come ye thankful people, come!"

VESPERS

Trying to live as normally as possible in these ridiculously abnormal times, we will follow our usual tradition here at St. Angela's and celebrate the Vespers on the evenings of all four Sundays of Advent. It's the official evening prayer of the Catholic Church, and is always celebrated in grand style at monasteries and cloistered convents. Our version is adapted especially for Advent, and includes the chanting of the prophecies that foretell the coming Messiah, and includes Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction. It's one of the best ways around for keeping Advent as its own discrete season of preparation for Christmas. It all starts next week, Sunday, Nov. 29, at 7:00PM in church. It will, of course, be live-streamed for those who cannot attend.

HOLY FAMILY SUNDAY

We are currently in the process of trying to organize a family sing-along of traditional and familiar Christmas Carols in our church on the afternoon of Sunday, Dec. 27, the feast of the Holy Family. I'm not sure exactly what it will entail (except for the obvious), but when it was proposed to me, it sounded like a lot of fun. I don't know whether or not we'll be able to pull it off, but mark it down; it could well actually *be* a lot of fun!

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Sadly, all that we know about most of the Twelve Apostles for sure is what we find in the Bible, and that isn't much. In fact, for many of them, all the Gospels give us is their names! Nonetheless, traditional legends sprang up and are still with us that chronicle their exploits in the post-Ascension era of the Church, including the stories of how they died (they were all martyred, except for St. John, and even he may have been martyred, too). Your task this week will be to match up each Apostle with the traditional manner of his martyrdom:

- 1. Crucified upside down in Nero's Circus at the base of Vatican Hill in Rome.

- 8. The first apostolic martyr, he was beheaded in Jerusalem at the order of King Herod.
- 9. Run through with a lance in India.
- 10. Thrown from the Pinnacle of the Temple and then stoned to death.


The need of our Neighbors in Need is great! Our Neighbors are struggling because their jobs have been lost and their living expenses have stayed the same.
