From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

BE MERCIFUL, O LORD, FOR WE HAVE SINNED...

We stand here now on the threshold of the holy season in which we seek renewal by way of penance and self-denial. All true progress in holiness begins with the understanding that we have sinned, are sinners, and need to repent. That is why we always begin every Mass with the *penitential* rite, where the priest summons us to call our sins to mind and beg forgiveness from Him who is offended by every sin. And so Lent begins this Wednesday with the placing of ashes on our foreheads with the sobering admonition: "Remember, man, that thou art dust and to dust thou shalt return!" There will be all kinds of special spiritual exercises here throughout this Lenten season: Stations of the Cross on Friday, the Lenten Speaker Series, Saturday morning Mass at 8:00, and extra times for Confession (in addition to the usual Saturday Confessions from 4:00-4:45PM) as we draw closer to Easter. LENTEN SPEAKER SERIES

For the past several years now, our parish has been blessed to be able to sponsor (in conjunction with Catholic Radio) a Lenten speaker series. This year, we have another good one. Each talk will take place right after the Friday evening Stations of the Cross.

There will be a special meeting of all our ushers on Thursday, March 5, at 7:00PM in the lunchroom. Also, anyone who would like to be an usher is also welcome to attend.

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC

Continuing a theme we began a couple of weeks ago, you are now being challenged to identify the following Catholic things that come in clusters of five, so name the members of these Catholic fiduciary quintets:

1. The Precepts of the Church are now officially numbered at five; name them.
2. Name the five "Books of Moses", aka the Pentateuch or Torah.
3. Name the five books of the New Testament that comprise the "Johannine Corpus".
4. Name the five Holy Days of Obligation that are observed as holy days in the U.S.
5. Name the five distinct "seasons" of the Church's Liturgical Calendar.
6. Name the five "families" of rites that comprise the "eastern rites" of the Church.
7. Name the five patriarchates (i.e., major centers of Catholic learning and practice) that were the foundation of the Church (and whose bishops are still called "patriarchs").
8. Name the two best-known cities of the "Pentapolis", i.e., the five cities destroyed by God in Genesis for their shameful vices.
9. The sacrament whereby our sins are forgiven is given five different titles in the *Catechism*; name them.
10. Name the five different "types" or "kinds" of miracle that Jesus performed on earth.

ANSWERS: 1. *Sunday (and Holy Day) Obligation to attend Mass, Confessing Sins (at least) Once yearly (if not in a state of grace), "Easter Duty" (i.e., receiving Communion at least once between Palm Sunday and Trinity Sunday), Obeying the Laws of Fast and Abstinence, Contribute to the Support of the Church (and the other two traditional ones: Follow the Marriage Laws and Participate in the Church's Missionary Activity)* 2. *Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, & Deuteronomy* 3. *Gospel of John, Book of Revelation (aka, "Apocalypse"), and the three Letters of John (viz., 1 John, 2 John and 3 John)* 4. *Motherhood of Mary (Jan. 1), Assumption of Mary (Aug. 15), All Saints Day (Nov. 1), Immaculate Conception of Mary (Dec. 8), & Christmas (Dec. 25)* 5. *Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time* 6. *Byzantine, Antiochene, Alexandrian, Armenian, and Edessan (aka, "Chaldean & Syro-Malabar")* 7. *Rome, Jerusalem, Alexandria, Constantinople, and Antioch* 8. *Sodom and Gomorrah* 9. *Confession, Penance, Reconciliation, Forgiveness, & Conversion* 10. *Nature (e.g., walking on water), Healing (e.g., cleansing lepers), Deliverance (e.g., exorcising demons), Victory Over Hostile Wills (e.g., cleansing the Temple), Resuscitation (e.g., raising the dead)*

QUOTE OF THE WEEK

"Christianity is the only God-willed religion. Therefore, it can never be placed complementarily side by side with other religions. Those would violate the truth of Divine Revelation, as it is unmistakably affirmed in the First Commandment of the Decalogue, who would assert that the diversity of religions is the Will of God. According to the Will of Christ, faith in Him and in His divine Teaching must replace other religions, however not by force, but by loving persuasion, as is expressed in the hymn for Lauds on the Feast of Christ the King: *"Non ille regna cladibus, non vi metuque subdidit: alto levatus stipite, amore traxit omnia."* ("He does not conquer kingdoms by the sword, nor by force or fear, but rather, raised high on the Cross, He draws all things to Himself by love.") - *Bishop Athanasius Schneider*
