

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY EUCHARIST!

PASSION ("PALM") SUNDAY

Normally, today begins the holiest time of the Church year. Even though this year has been, so far, the furthest thing from normal, we are still celebrating Palm Sunday Mass and the special Masses of Holy Week as usual, except, of course, without a congregation. That includes Easter as well. I hope and pray that we can be back to normal in a couple of weeks (and I ask you to join me in that prayer!).

WHAT THE PARISH IS DOING IN RESPONSE

I sent out a letter this week on this topic and I hope you all received it and kept it handy. But, to reiterate, here's what's going on:

- We will be "live-streaming" daily Mass from our parish; they tell me that it is now it's up and running, so you will be able to access it from the parish website

QUOTE OF THE WEEK

"Some endeavours were used to suppress the printing of such books as terrified the people, and frighten the dispersers of them, some of whom were taken up; but nothing was done in it, as I am informed, the Government being unwilling to exasperate the people, who were, as I may, out of their wits already.

Neither can I acquit those ministers that in their sermons rather sank than lifted up the hearts of their hearers. Many of them, no doubt, did it for the strengthening of the resolution of the people, and especially for quickening them to repentance, but it certainly answered not their end, at least not in proportion to the injury it did another way; and, indeed, as God Himself through the whole Scriptures rather draws to Him by invitations and calls to turn to Him and live, than drives us by terror and amazement, so I must confess I thought the ministers should have done also, imitating our Blessed Lord and Master in this, that His whole Gospel is full of declarations from heaven of God's mercy, and His readiness to receive penitents and forgive them, complaining, 'Ye will not come unto Me that ye may have life', and that, therefore, His Gospel is called 'the Gospel of Peace' and 'the Gospel of Grace'." - Daniel Dafoe, excerpted from his "Journal of the Plague Year"

PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. Everyone ministering to minors and vulnerable adults (clergy, employees and volunteers) in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system before December 31, 2020. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. In addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please go to

www.preventandprotectstl.org to register. Click "Register" below the LOG IN button. Enter the passcode stlprotect. Select the type of location where you are a volunteer or employee. Select the specific location by name: St. Angela Merici Parish. Contact Linda Brindley, our parish Child Safety Coordinator, at 314 -838-6565 with any questions or for further assistance. This should take about an hour to do. Thanks in advance for taking care of this.
