From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT NOVEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE SOULS IN PURGATORY AND DECEMBER IS THE MONTH OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION!

THE YEAR OF GRACE, 2023

With this Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, the Year of Grace 2022 is laid to rest, never to be seen again, and the new one, 2023 is born. Like all new beginnings, it gives us hope. 2022 was good to us in many ways. If for nothing else, we will always be grateful for the Dobbs ruling of the Supreme Court that overturned its unjust, tyrannical, and just plain bad ruling in Roe. But there's still much more work to be done. Every year, the Church provides its liturgical cycle of feasts and seasons as vehicles whereby we will not just remember and celebrate the events of our salvation, but that we will actually re-live them. By means of her holy Liturgy, Mother Church makes it possible for us, even though we are removed from their first occurrence by 2,000 years, to be partakers in them still. In Advent, we re-live the longing of a sinful, but not abandoned, people, as they yearned for a Savior. He came once, He will come again. Let's keep ready!

ADVENT VESPERS

Next Sunday is the First Sunday of Advent, and the Church's whole cycle of feasts and seasons that comprises our Liturgical Calendar renews itself. As has been our custom here at St. Angela's for the past several years, we will celebrate the Church's solemn evening prayer (or, "vespers") in grand style on the evenings of all four of Advent's Sundays, starting at 7:00 each night. Also as in the past, we will have an *ad hoc* choir of singers (comprising all ages and both sexes) to advance the praise of God by chanting the prophecies and canticles. It's a wonderful experience! And so I ask two things of you: first, plan on making it a big part of your Advent preparations for the Coming of Christ. (And invite your children and their children to join us, too – it becomes one of the most cherished memories of childhood for those who participate!) Second, lend your voice to this *ad hoc* choir. Not Pavarotti? Not a problem! Come to the lunchroom by 6:15 next Sunday for a brief rehearsal. (I suspect you already know the melodies, anyway – they're pretty simple!) Also: the *ad hoc* choir dresses in black pants & white shirts/blouses.

HE CAME TO CALL SINNERS

Christ did many things when He walked the earth. Most of all, He came to save us. From what? From sin, for sinners we are and very much in need of His saving grace. Perhaps the best thing He left us was the sacrament by which our sins are forgiven, namely Confession. The greatest peace you will ever experience in life is when you hear the words, "I absolve you from your sins…" after a good confession. There will be special times for the sacrament all through Advent. You should have gotten by now my Advent/Christmas letter. Hang onto it. It has all the Confession times. Additionally, this week I'll be hearing confessions right after the 8:00AM Mass on Tuesday (in addition to the usual Saturday confessions, of course).
