From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY!

ROE V. WADE (THE MOVIE)

Much ado has been exercised over this historically bad Supreme Court decision in the past couple of weeks since the leak of the (apparent and long overdue) cleansing of this stain upon our national history. If it's true, then we are about to see something akin to the passing of the 13th Amendment, which overturned the dreadful Dred Scott decision. One of the more interesting features of the "outrage" that's being expressed by the pro-abortion forces, is the obvious attempt to make this a "Catholic issue". It's interesting because that is *precisely* the same tactic that the pro-abortion advocates employed back in the late 60's/early 70's in their attempt to garner national acceptance of abortion. They wanted to exploit the resident anti-Catholic prejudice that still exists among many of our fellow countrymen and marshal it against those who wished to save babies. There have been protests, some of which included acts of vandalism, at many Catholic churches around the country. Historian and sociologist, Dr. Philip Jenkins of Penn State, called anti-Catholicism the last acceptable prejudice in America. Well, you certainly don't see anybody in the mainstream media getting upset about it, or even reporting it, but it's all around us.

The story behind the infamous *Roe* decision is told in a very forthright, factual, and compelling way in the motion picture "*Roe v. Wade*", which just came out last year. Comprising an all-star cast, it tells the story of *Roe* through the eyes of a man who was at the very forefront of the movement, a man who worked, and worked *hard*, for the other side, Dr. Bernard Nathanson. Nathanson operated the biggest abortion clinic in America (and probably the world), personally performed thousands of abortions, and later became a pro-life zealot and promoter of our cause. His story chronicles all the lies, cover-ups, and outright chicanery that were inflicted upon the American people, through complicit and uncritical media, which led to the *Roe* decision and, ultimately, the deaths of over 50 million of our fellow countrymen. (That is a *reliable* statistic.)

We've already shown this movie twice, but I'm going to show it a third time because I want everyone to know the truth. At the same time, I heartily recommend another film, *Unplanned*, which tells the true story of a woman who herself had abortions, was "employee of the year" for Planned Parenthood, but who, after seeing the blood on her hands (like Dr. Nathanson), had a complete reversal of heart, became a staunch pro-lifer, and, ultimately, the mother of eight! QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC
