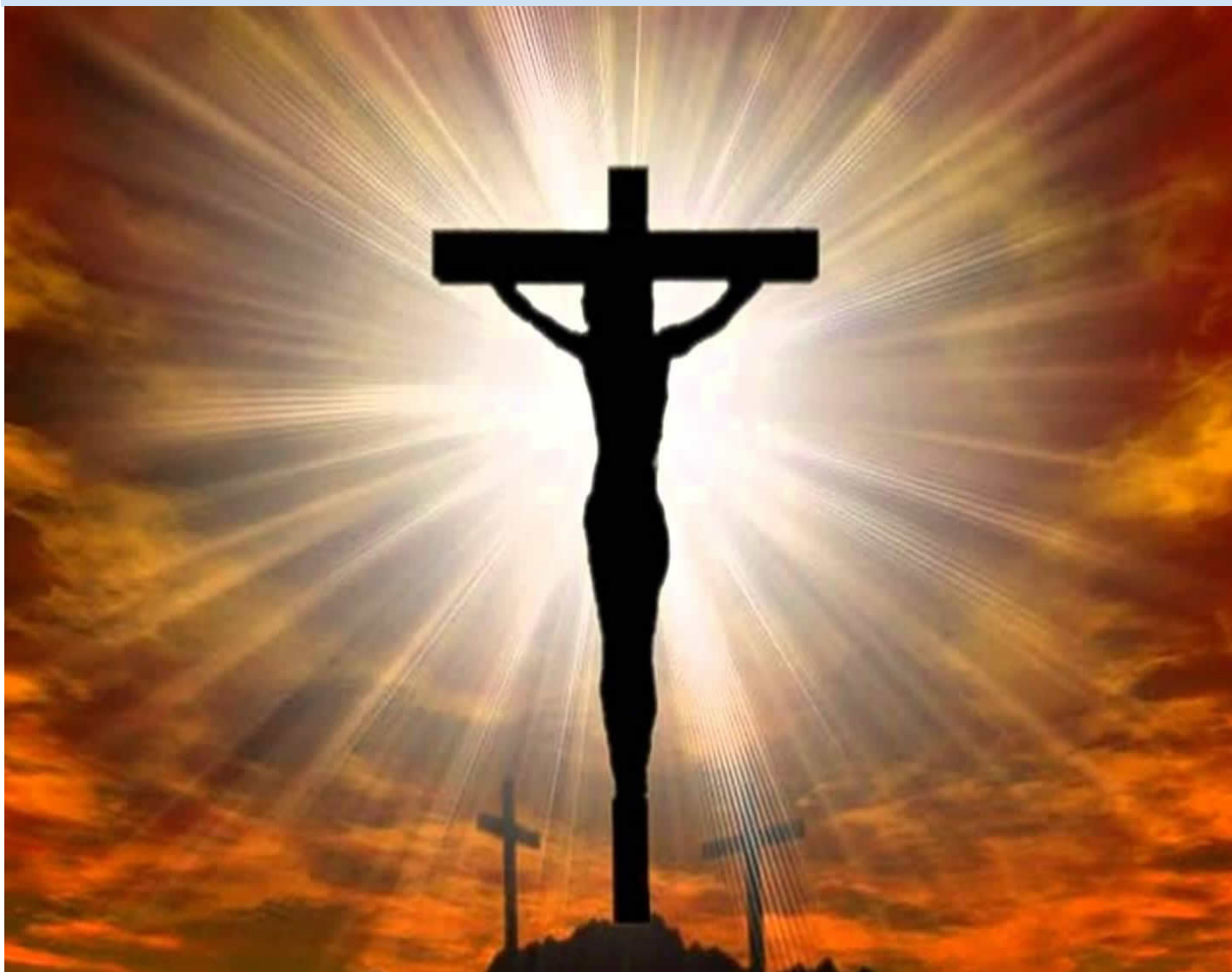

FOOD FOR THE POOR

Next weekend (Sept. 17/18) Franciscan Fr. Robert Karris will visit our parish and offer all the Masses, making an appeal to our parish on behalf of his organization, Food for the Poor. The name pretty much tells the whole story, so I won't steal any of Fr. Karris' thunder and say much more about it. That's his job and he does it very well. There are brochures for Food for the Poor in the pews and on the tables in the vestibule. I will take the occasion of Fr. Karris' visit to attend a Catholic conference in Omaha that weekend, and will be absent from the parish. Please welcome father and be as generous as you can to his appeal.

CALLING ALL PILGRIMS! (Again!)

There will be a meeting this Monday (Sept. 12) in the lunchroom at 7:00PM for anyone who might be interested in taking a pilgrimage with me to Italy some time in the next year. At this meeting I hope to find out who and how many would like to go, when they'd like to go, and where they'd like to go. Even if you're just curious, come along (you don't have to be a parishioner).

CROISSANTS & CAPPUCINO!

This Monday, the Feast of the Holy name of Mary, was established to honor the holy name of the Blessed Virgin, of course, but it also commemorates the victory of the Catholic forces over those of an over-aggressive Islam at the Siege of Vienna in 1683. Victory was more or less assured when the staunch Catholic defenders invoked the Holy Name of Mary as their battle cry. To celebrate the victory, pastry chefs in Vienna concocted a special, crescent-shaped pastry (in imitation of the Islamic crescent) and served a beverage brewed from the sacks of strange beans found in the camps of the defeated enemy. The Europeans found the beverage to be too bitter, so Capuchin priest, Bd. Marco D'Aviano (whose fiery rhetoric the night before the battle helped rouse the troops to victory) suggested adding a bit of milk to it. They did, and it was delicious, and, since the color of the new mixture was the same as the Capuchin habit, it became known as CAPPUCINO! Since then, it has been customary to serve those items on that feast and, since we are traditional-type people, that's exactly what we're going to do. So, come to the 8:00AM Mass tomorrow, Sept. 12, and stay for a croissant (along with other breakfast foods as well)!

MASS AT PIPERS' CHAPEL

It's always a treat when the Pipers invite us to their home chapel. If you are able to come, be sure to sign the list in the lunchroom (we need an accurate count for the dinner and chapel). You can either meet here on the parking lot (at 4:00PM) and carpool over, or just meet there by 5:00PM (if you know the way). Thursday, Sept. 22, Everybody (including non-parishioners) is welcome!
