REMEMBER THAT MARCH IS THE MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH!

AND SPEAKING OF ST. JOSEPH...

Next Sunday, March 19, is the feast of St. Joseph, or, rather, it *would* be if it didn't fall on Sunday. When that happens, the Lenten Sunday supersedes even a feast as big as St. Joseph's, and the saint's feast is transferred to the next available day (in this case, it's Monday, March 20). Nevertheless, we will still be distributed the wonderful St. Joseph Bread (the good stuff from The Hill) after the Masses next weekend. All we ask is for a donation to help the poor (Vincent de Paul Society); that's what the custom is founded on, namely, St. Joseph providential compassion.

HAIL, GLORIOUS ST. PATRICK!

This Friday is the feast of that most famous of all the Irish, St. Patrick himself. I understand that the archbishop has already issued a blanket dispensation for those who want to celebrate that feast in traditional style, despite its being a Lenten Friday. In any case, I grant dispensation, too, to any who will partake of the corned beef and cabbage this Friday. Enjoy!

LENTEN SPIRITUAL EXERCISES

Our 2023 Beneficiary: Beth Jennerjohn

Bethany was originally diagnosed with stage 3 Breast cancer in 2011. Her boys Gabriel (a 2019 Hazelwood west graduate) and Nathan (a Junior at Hazelwood West) were 9 and 5 years old at the time. After a year of surgeries and treatment she was Cancer free and in remission for 10 years. In June of 2021 she found out that the cancer had returned aggressively. Spreading to her lymph nodes, ribs and spine. Her diagnosis was stage 4 Metastatic Breast Cancer. There is unfortunately no cure for Metastatic Breast cancer. After her first line of chemotherapy stopped working after 6 months, her next option was a clinical trial at WashU. She has been undergoing immunotherapy and 2 new chemotherapies weekly for the last 9 months and is responding well. She remains strong and hopeful for a long future with her family that she loves and that love her very much.
