

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER THAT MARCH IS THE MONTH OF ST. JOSEPH!

THIS WOULD HAVE BEEN THE FEAST OF ST. JOSEPH...

...but since it fell on one of the Sundays of Lent, it got moved to tomorrow (March 20). The date is different, but the feast is the same, and we will celebrate it in grand style. It's an old, cross-cultural custom to bless and distribute a specially-baked bread on his feast day, in recognition of his unique role as the "breadwinner" of the Holy Family. We have been observing this custom for the past several years now, and today is not exception. Not only does this bread honor St. Joseph, but it's *really, really* good bread (from Vitale's, on The Hill), and will fittingly grace your family table. The blessed loaves will be available after Mass today and tomorrow (if the supply holds); all we ask is a donation to the Vincent de Paul Society. Come to Mass tomorrow for St. Joseph's Feast; we will pray his litany afterward.

"LAETARE, HIEROSOLYMA!"

With that sturdy exhortation (which comprises the words of today's Entrance Antiphon in Latin), the prophet calls us to *rejoice* with all *Jerusalem*. Why? Because this is the rose-colored Sunday of Lent, a time for modified rejoicing. The penitential season is slightly more than half-over. We've weathered each storm so far, so it's time for a bit of a break. Rejoice, indeed: our deliverance is at hand!

- 7. Who was the woman who, according to legend, wiped Jesus' bloody face with her veil?
- 8. Who was the Roman soldier who thrust his spear into Jesus' side?
- 9. Who was the "Good Thief" crucified with Jesus, whom Jesus promised paradise?
- 10. Who was the "Bad Thief", also crucified with Jesus, but who cursed Him?

ANSWERS: 1. Nicodemus (but there is also the tradition that they were the leftovers from the myrrh given by the Magi) 2. Caiaphas 3. Malchus 4. Herod Antipas 5. Joseph of Arimathea 6. "Claudia", "Procula" or "Procula Claudia" 7. St. Veronica 8. St. Longinus 9. St. Dismas (a.k.a., "Titus" and "Zothan") 10. Gestas (a.k.a., "Dumachus" and "Chammatha")


