

#### SPIRITUAL ADOPTION

Second month in the development of the unborn baby Your baby is growing very

quickly. He is now 1 ½ inches long and weighs 1/30 of an ounce. But if he were to keep growing all 9 months as fast as he grows during this second month, he would be 14 tons at birth! Luckily, the growth rate slows dramatically so that he will probably weigh somewhere between 7 and 8 pounds at birth. All internal organs, his heart, stomach, liver and kidneys, are present and beginning to work. Brain waves have been recorded at 40 days. Your baby's fingerprints are formed and will never change except for size. On the prayer card, it has a place to fill in the baby's name. This could be any baby in danger of being aborted. If you wish, you can give it a name.
