From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER: FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

THERESA PROSSER, ADIEU

When I arrived at St. Angela's ten years ago, one of the first of my new parishioners whom I met was our consecrated virgin, Theresa Prosser. I was much intrigued. I had never had such a person as a parishioner and wondered how this was going to work out. Not that I had many trepidations about the prospect of dealing with her, but the few I had quickly evaporated. It worked out beautifully. For the many years she served our parish (more than the ten I've put in so far), she had been a *heavenly* blessing to us all. I'm not talking about the many services she's rendered (as a sacristan and otherwise), or the committees she's served on (too numerous to mention), or even just taking part in all the parish activities (from the Germanfest to all the spiritual exercises). St. Angela's was her second home and she was always here, praying. She made it clear that she was 100% dedicated to Christ. In so doing, she delivered the most eloquent and powerful expression of faith of all. You just can't replace people like her easily, or even at all. We wish her our very best, our love, appreciation, and gratitude...we will miss her terribly...

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Ordinarily, today, Feb. 11, would be the World Day of Prayer for the sick. Since it falls on Sunday, not so this year. It has been our practice in recent years to have a communal Anointing of the Sick, and since the sick are still hurting despite the vicissitudes of the calendar, we will have the communal anointing tomorrow, i.e., Monday, Feb. 12, at the 8:00AM Mass. Who is eligible for this *sacrament* (it's not just a "blessing")? Being a *sacrament*, it is not given to non-Catholics. It is also not given for minor or trivial ailments, such as a blister, or sniffle, or a stubbed toe. Nor does it have to be a life-threatening affliction. The instruction says that it is for Catholics whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age, especially if the condition is chronic and/or there's a rather large amount of physical pain attached to it. If one has been anointed in the recent past (a month or two), he is not usually re-anointed, unless the condition has deteriorated. If you would like to be anointed, come to Mass tomorrow and sit over by St. Joseph. I'll instruct you from there.

ASH WEDNESDAY...

...is this Wednesday. We will have three Masses that day, at 6:30 & 8:00AM, and then at 7:00PM. Ashes, of course, will be distributed at all three. The Lord spent 40 days praying and fasting to begin His Public Life of service and the Redemption of the human race. Let us spend Lent's holy 40 days in preparation for the renewal of Easter, beginning with the acknowledgement of our sins and the inevitability of our mortality. There will be special times for Confession; I'll send you a letter with all that info.

QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC




