From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER: FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY FAMILY!

LENT

This is Lent's first Sunday and with it, we hear once again the story of Jesus' forty-day fast in the desert. It's precisely that event that serves as the model for our observance of the Lenten season. Jesus' time in the desert was preparation for His Public Life. The catechumens (those preparing to become Catholic at Easter) use Lent as preparation to receive the sacraments of initiation on Holy Saturday night. And our forty-day observance of Lent is to prepare us to renew our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. It is a time of renewal. At every moment of every day your body is slowly renewing itself, creating new cells to replace the ones which, their usefulness being spent, are simultaneously discarded. Your body does this because it's alive. If it stops renewing itself, it dies. The soul is the same way; if it doesn't renew, it dies. The whole point of Lent is that we are supposed to be better people on Easter Sunday than we were on Ash Wednesday. We have many ways to make that happen all through Lent: Stations, Confession, daily Mass, Eucharistic adoration, etc. Let us make good use of them (it saves us from having to do a whole lot of 'splainin' at our judgement.)"




