

There are many things in the St. Louis area that are named for some of the early Catholic missionaries here. See whether or not you can identify the following:

- 1. The renowned Jesuit for whom a park in South St. Louis and a lodge in Jersey County, Illinois are named.
- 2. The missionary to Florissant after whom a park and public grade school are named.
- 3. The great Jesuit missionary, recognized for the role he played in the success of the American Revolution, who has a high school in Waterloo, Ill named for him.
- 4. The Jesuit missionary for whom a Jesuit high school in Creve Coeur is named.
- 5. The well-known entity in South St. Louis named for two Jesuit missionaries: Frs. Gabriel Manest and François Pinet.
- 6. The Vincentian missionary, who accomplished marvels before he died at only 42, and after whom a Catholic high school in North St. Louis had been named.
- 7. The Vincentian missionary who became St. Louis's first bishop and has a high school named for him, too.
- 8. The obscure missionary from Germany who founded Immaculate Conception Parish in Union, MO, became the chief of all chaplains in the U.S. Army, was the personal friend of six U.S. presidents, negotiated many treaties between the U.S. government and Catholic countries, was named "Large Pine Tree" by the Sioux tribe, and has a town in Texas named for him.
- 9. The small, triangular park located at Lindell & Vandeventer, formerly named for the Irish missionary who became our first archbishop.
- 10. The last of the missionaries to serve as our bishop, he has a hospital and the seminary named after him who is he?
