

#### REMEMBER: APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT!

#### HE IS RISEN...HE IS TRULY RISEN!

A most blessed Easter to all! As St. Paul says, if Christ is not risen, your faith is vain. Other witnesses throughout the centuries have pointed out that all Christianity's enemies have to do to refute us is to come up with the moldering, dead bones of the Crucified Jesus. Starting with the earliest days of the Church and down through all the centuries, God's enemies have tried, but to no avail. Even these same enemies have to admit that Jesus' tomb was empty. And maybe their cack-and-a-bull stories about St. Peter's having stolen Jesus' dead body might bear a ring of truth, except that this fraud, if, indeed it is, has changed the course of human history and enlightened a darkened world. The many witnesses for Christ, His martyrs, tell the same beautiful story, and it's a story they know not from what they've heard, but from what they've experienced: Jesus Christ is truly risen and makes it possible for all of us to share His Risen Life. ALLELUIA!

#### HOW LOVELY IS THY DWEILLING PLACE, LORD GOD OF HOSTS!

True to our customs here at St. Angela's, the decorating of our parish church has beggared all the superlatives. From the enshrouding of the holy images to initiate Passiontide, through the red and green of Palm Sunday, through the Gethsemane of Maundy Thursday, the Tomb of Good Friday, and. last of all, the glorious empty tomb and brilliant blooms of Easter Sunday, this year's decorations have kept pace with all previous efforts, for their design and execution. #### AND EVEN MORE...

...I know our gardeners have already started getting the flower beds ready for yet another season of horticultural delight. Along with the decorations in church for the major feasts, our gardens give glory to God and witness to the community of the vibrancy, vigor, and vitality of the faith our parishioners have, and testify concretely to their love of God and His people. We're expecting great things once again (and looking for any more who might wish to help!).

#### **QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC**
