

# From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

#### REMEMBER: APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT!

#### HOW LOVELY IS THY DWELLING PLACE (still more stuff!)...

Every year, we get all kinds of visitors who admire and are edified by the beauty of our church decorations for both Christmas and Easter. More than the esthetic delight that their eyes behold, however, is the admiration they have for the care, commitment, and devotion that they (rightly) infer must be here in order for it all to take place. They leave here with the distinct feeling that the parishioners of St. Angela really know their faith, really believe their faith mightily, and deeply love their parish and its church. It happened again this year, but on an even larger scale. I have had more people than ever come up to me and, in a manner totally unsolicited, tell me how our church is more than beautiful, it's actually inspirational. This is true because it really is an expression of the faith of true believers made visible. I'm reminded of the wisdom of G. K. Chesterton who once observed that: "The Romans didn't love Rome because she was the most beautiful city in the world; they loved her because she was their city, and so they made her the most beautiful city in the world." What we have here now is the culmination of 62 years of the faith and devotion of people who are truly faithful and devout. It makes a powerful statement to our community!

#### **QUIZ-A-CATHOLIC**

We haven't had a quiz on Easter yet this year, so this one will suffice. See how much you know about the greatest feast of the Catholic Church:

- 1. The year of Jesus' Birth is unknown to us, but we're certain about the Resurrection; in what year did it take place?
- 2. Who was the first one to see Jesus' tomb empty?
- 3. What does the word "Easter" mean?
- 4. How did hard-boiled eggs become associated with Easter?
- 5. How did a rabbit become associated with Easter?
- 6. How much time did Jesus spend on earth after His Resurrection?
- 7. Our converts in the RCIA program are called "candidates" before Advent, "catechumens" after Advent, and "elect" during Lent...so what are they now called?
- 8. Where did Jesus first appear to His disciples after His Resurrection?
- 9. How long is Easter season and what great feast ends it?
- 10. What was Jesus doing with the Apostles in the 40 days from the Resurrection to His Ascension?

ANSWERS: 1. 33AD 2. One supposes that the Roman guards were actually the first, but the first of Jesus' disciples was St. Mary Magdalene 3. It derives from the same root word from which we also get the word "east"; unsurprisingly, it means, "dawn" or "sunrise" 4. As a little chick breaks through the thin shell that entombed him and emerges into his new life, that becomes a symbol of Christ's breaking free from the bands of death and emerging from His Tomb into His new, risen life 5. The natural fertility of springtime is itself a symbol of the new life of Jesus, and so it is most befitting that it's the season for Easter to occur. It was believed that rabbits became intensely "fertile" this time of year (and so we have Lewis Carroll giving us the figure of the industrious "March Hare"), and so, blending many things together, we now have a really large rabbit dropping off the eggs mentioned above in #4 6. 40 days 7. "Catholics" (or, more properly, "neophyte Catholics") 8. The Cenacle (or, "Upper Room") in Jerusalem 9. Fifty days, ending on Pentecost 10. We don't know for sure; we presume He was preparing them for the coming of the Holy Spirit and His departure from this world (but if you have any "inside intel" that we don't, please let us know!) NB: If you did poorly on this quiz, do not castigate yourself too severely; a couple of years ago at Christmas, one of the media "anchors" pulled a Ron Burgundy and called that the feast of Christ's "Resurrection"!


