

From The Desk of Msgr. Matthew Mitas:

REMEMBER: APRIL IS THE MONTH OF THE HOLY SPIRIT!

THE DIVINE MERCY

One of the better additions to our Catholic piety and practice since the Vatican Council is the "Divine Mercy" observance. Based on the Lord's revelations to St. Faustina Kowalska, this special program of prayers takes place every year on the Second Sunday of Easter (the Sunday within the Octave of Easter). It occurs on the day when the Church universally reads the tract from St. John's Gospel when the Lord, freshly risen from His Tomb, transfers to His apostles the power to forgive sins in His Name. Christ's main work is and always has been the salvation of souls, and, if this feast day does nothing else, it punctuates the fact that it is God's desire that all be saved. To make that happen, of course, it requires our cooperation. Let's not squander this opportunity of grace!

HOW LOVELY IS THY DWEILLING PLACE, LORD GOD OF HOSTS (part 2)!

When I wrote in last week's bulletin about the beauty of our Holy Week & Easter decorations, it was sight unseen; writing a couple of weeks in advance, I had to meet early deadlines and I just assumed that the decorations would be absolutely wonderful, as, indeed, they have always been in the past. Well, I was wrong. This year's efforts *surpassed* all previous ones, and lit up the social media in North County with postings that simply overflowed with awe and praise, but also with gratitude. They are grateful that there are those who embrace the mysteries of our faith and the truth of our salvation to such an extent that they go to such an extent to communicate them in such a beautiful and awe-inspiring manner. I say it again: WELL DONE, good and faithful servants! (By the way, there's a great visual record of everything on the parish website, including the time-lapse video of the whole project.)

THE ANNUNCIATION

Everybody knows that the feast of the Lord's Annunciation takes place on March 25 (nine months before Jesus' birth). This is true all the time, expect when that day falls within Holy Week or Easter Week. When that happens (as it did this year) this great feast is not ignored; it is moved to the first day when it can be celebrated, which, in our circumstance, will be tomorrow, Monday, April 8. Mary's famous "fiat" was the key that marked the end of the Old Testament and unlocked the great events of our Redemption. Come and celebrate together this great festival of our salvation!

The 2 Sunday (which is the "Divine Mercy"), and the 4 Sunday, "Good Shepherd Sunday" (when that specific Gospel is read) 9. Low Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, Quasimodo Sunday, 2 Sunday of Easter 10.
