Communion of Saints Devotion

The month of November has traditionally been a time when the Church celebrates the Communion of Saints, prays for those who have died, and prepares us to welcome the one St. Francis called "Sister Death". In keeping with this tradition, we will be creating Communion of Saints devotion areas, on which we will honor, not only some recognized Saints of the Church but our loved ones who have gone before us. We are inviting families to share with us a photograph (in a frame if possible) of loved ones who have died. In order to design the devotional spaces, we ask photos be turned into the Parish Office or brought to the sacristy of the church by October 26th

"... whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Luke 18: 4

This weekend Jesus continues to teach his disciples, and us as well, through parables. Today's parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector extend the theme of prayer that we reflected on last Sunday in the parable of the persistent widow and the unjust judge. That parable was about the promise of persistent prayer; today's parable is about the peril of presumptuous prayer. The Gospel for this Sunday, from Luke 18:9-14, presents the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. It is a profound lesson on humility, self-awareness, and the posture of our hearts in prayer.

In the parable, the Pharisee boasts of his righteousness, listing his good deeds and comparing himself to others, particularly the tax collector. Meanwhile, the tax collector, standing at a distance, humbly acknowledges his sinfulness and pleads for God's mercy. Jesus concludes by saying that the tax collector, not the Pharisee, went home justified before God.

This story challenges us to reflect on our own attitudes. Are we like the Pharisee, quick to judge others and prideful in our accomplishments? Or are we like the tax collector, aware of our need for God's grace and mercy? True humility is not about thinking less of ourselves but recognizing our dependence on God and treating others with compassion and respect.

The message is clear: God values a contrite and humble heart over outward displays of piety. As we approach God in prayer, let us do so with sincerity, acknowledging our imperfections and trusting in His boundless mercy. This humility not only deepens our relationship with God but also fosters greater love and understanding toward others.

May we strive to grow in the virtue of humility and when we come to God in prayer, may our prayer be sincere,
