

# MASS INTENTIONS

If you would like to have a Mass celebrated for a loved one—deceased or living—contact Linda at the Parish Office at 314-838-6565 or stop by the office. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. There are infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefits one's soul. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass. We have Mass Cards available in the office you can give to the family of a deceased person or Special Intention Cards for living, for a special occasion or for healing.

# St. John Lateran - Spiritual Home for All Catholics:

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, a day that invites us to reflect on the significance of this sacred space and what it represents for the Church and for each of us as believers.

The Basilica of St. John Lateran, often called the "Mother and Head of all Churches," holds a unique place in the history of Christianity. It is the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope, and was the first public Christian church built after Emperor Constantine legalized Christianity in the 4th century. Its dedication reminds us of the enduring presence of God among His people and the unity of the Church across the world.

In the first reading from Ezekiel (47:1-2, 8-10, 12), we hear of a life-giving river flowing from the temple, bringing renewal and abundance wherever it goes. This imagery reminds us that the Church is not just a building but a source of spiritual nourishment and life for the world. Like the river, the Church is called to flow outward, bringing healing, hope, and renewal to all.

In the Gospel (John 2:13-22), Jesus cleanses the temple, emphasizing the sacredness of God's house. Yet, He also points to Himself as the true temple, foreshadowing His death and resurrection. This reminds us that while we honor physical churches as places of worship, the true dwelling place of God is within us. We are called to be living temples, reflecting His presence in our lives.

As we celebrate this feast, let us give thanks for the gift of the Church, both as a physical space where we gather to worship and as a spiritual community united in Christ. On this day, may we be inspired to renew our commitment to being living stones, building up the Body of Christ and sharing His love with the world,
