



2025 JUBILEE YEAR "PILGRIMS OF HOPE"

A Jubilee Year is a special year of reconciliation and forgiveness that the Universal Church traditionally proclaims every 25 years. The first Christian Jubilee was instituted by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300. The Jubilee Year began on Christmas Eve 2024 and ends on January 6, 2026 The opening of the Holy Door at the Vatican is the most well-known and moving ritual, marking the beginning of the Jubilee year. The first documented account of the Holy Door opening ceremony at St. Peter's Basilica for the Jubilee dates back to 1500 under Pope Alexander VI. The Holy Doors are only opened during the Jubilee Year. They represent a passage from sin to grace, a new beginning, a deeper encounter with Christ, a passage to salvation, and a renewal of faith. The doors are normally sealed with mortar and cement. The Pope ceremonially opens the doors to allow pilgrims to pass through.

The Holy Doors are located in the Papal major basilicas in Rome. The most famous Holy Door is in St. Peter's Basilica Other Holy Doors are located in St. John Lateran, St. Paul Outside the Walls, and St. Mary Major

The theme for the 2025 Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope" Pope Francis has called on Catholics to renew their hope in Christ, one another, and the world. The year is a time to strengthen relationships, repent for sins, and forgive others.
