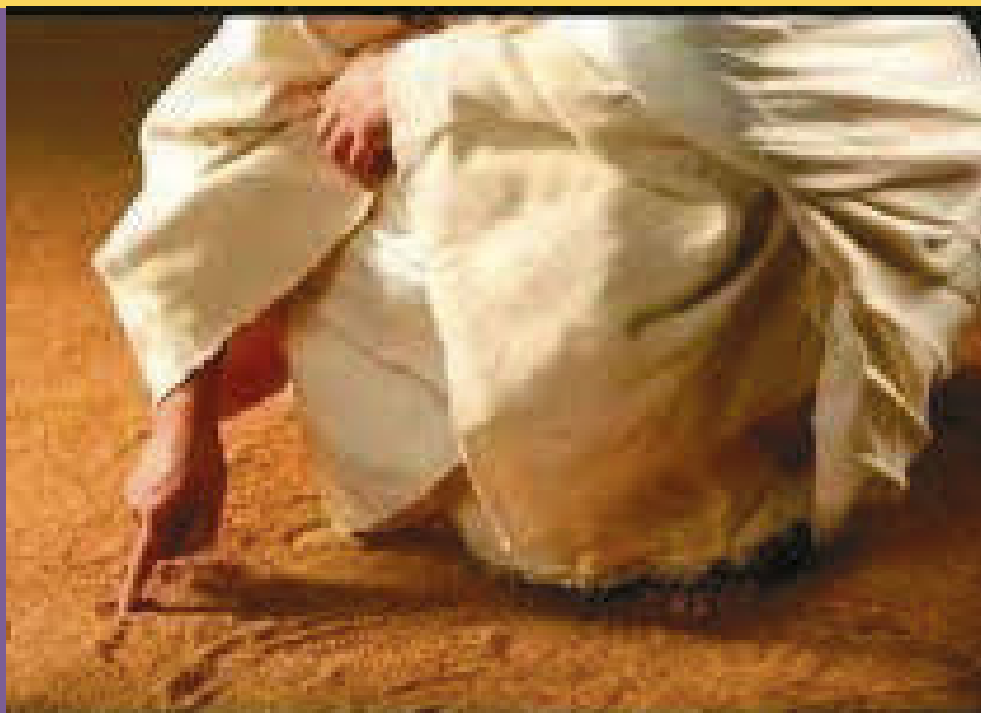

Pondering With Deacon George:

Then Jesus straightened up and said to her,
"Woman, where are they?
Has no one condemned you?"
She replied, "No one, sir."
Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you.
Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

A wise person once said that we cannot know the heart of another human being. How true that statement is. In this weekend's gospel, the religious leaders, who throughout John's gospel are looking for a reason to arrest Jesus and put him to death, seeks to test Jesus and trick him into judging the woman accused of adultery. Jesus does not fall for the trap, but instead, challenges everyone in the crowd, and us too, to look inwardly. The gospel given to us this weekend is a call to compassion and mercy. This is what we are called to do, not only during this Season of Lent, but throughout our lives of discipleship, to fast from judging others and see others, like Jesus, through eyes of mercy and compassion.

The beginning of Holy Week is just one week away. As we approach this most sacred time in our liturgical calendar, it's a good time to ask ourselves how are we on our Lenten journey of conversion, of striving to be more like Christ? Do we show the love and mercy of Jesus, or do we rather throw stones? Do we acknowledge our own sinfulness and need of God's mercy, or do we get discouraged by our failures that we try them hide them from others? Do we reach out to the needs of others, or do stay blind to their suffering and pain?

We are called to a change of heart this holy season, a heart that reflect the heart of Jesus; a heart that radiates love, compassion, mercy and forgiveness. We are reminded this weekend, that as sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others. Jesus, the one without sin, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness.

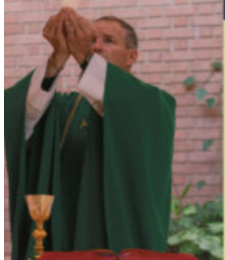

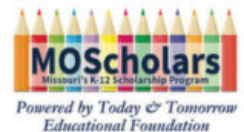

TENEBRAE SERVICE AT SACRED HEART IN FLORISSANT ON APRIL 16TH

Prepare your heart for the Triduum - come to Sacred Heart Florissant on Wednesday night of Holy Week for a night of peaceful music, chanted Psalms, and reflection on the events of Holy Thursday. Between 6:30-8:30pm we will hold this sung celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours, originating in the 9th century, called "Tenebrae" or "darkness" because it is celebrated in a darkened church. As Psalms are chanted and readings are read, 15 candles are gradually extinguished, one after each Psalm, until only one remains. Feel free to arrive late or leave early as your schedule permits. On the eve of the Triduum, we hope you will be able to join us in prayerful stillness, and experience the deep riches of the Church's musical tradition.
