MASS INTENTIONS

If you would like to have a Mass celebrated for a loved one— deceased or living—contact Linda at the Parish Office at 314-838-6565 or stop by the office. The stipend is \$10 per Mass. There are infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefits one's soul. The special ministerial fruits of the Mass are applied to the particular intention of the Mass. We have MANY open dates and times! The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originated in the very early Church. We have Mass Cards available in the office you can give to the family of a deceased person or Special Intention Cards for living, for a special occasion or for healing.



“I was blind and now I see.”

The Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as Laetare Sunday, offers us a glimpse of joy and hope amidst the Lenten journey. Our Gospel today invites us to reflect on spiritual blindness and the transformative power of encountering Christ. This Sunday we are reminded to rejoice in God’s mercy as we journey from darkness to light.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus encounters a man blind from birth. His disciples, echoing common beliefs of the time, wonder if the man’s blindness is a result of his own sin or his parents’. Jesus dismisses this notion, saying, “Neither this man nor his parents sinned; he was born blind so that the works of God might be revealed in him.” Jesus then heals the man, restoring his sight and revealing himself as the Light of the World.

This story is an invitation to examine our own spiritual vision. The healing is not just about recovering physical sight, but about receiving the gift of faith—a new way of seeing reality through the eyes of Christ. The man’s journey from darkness to light is a metaphor for our own path of conversion.

We all experience moments of spiritual blindness—times when our fears, biases, or distractions keep us from seeing God’s presence in our lives and in others. Lent is a season for letting go of these obstacles, opening our hearts to the light of Christ, and allowing him to heal and transform us. The blind man’s response to Jesus is one of faith and gratitude, while the Pharisees, though physically able to see, remain closed off by their own certainties and pride.

This week we can take to our prayer: Where do I experience spiritual blindness in my life? What keeps me from seeing God’s presence?

As we journey through the final weeks of Lent, let us pray for the grace to recognize Christ present in our midst, and to become witnesses to the transforming power of his love,
